





It's the find-the-word game set among the stars! Start at a letter and travel around the paths, forming words as you go. In the PuzzleNation game, you're trying to form as many four-, five-, or six-letter words as you can before time expires. In this puzzle, we've hidden four words (of four to seven letters) in each star, all of them belonging to a particular category. Word lengths are given to you, as is a single letter in each word. Letters may be used more than once, even within a single word. Unused letters, reading roughly from left to right, will spell out your 11-letter answer.












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
On PuzzleNation, the faster you circle the words, the more points you score, and the louder you can brag to your friends. In this puzzle, we've taken 11 three-word phrases. For each phrase, two of three words are hidden in the word search, and the remaining word is not. (The missing word is always the one with a shaded square in the list below.) Using the blanks and starting letters in the list below as a guide, figure out all the phrases and write them into the list. The shaded boxes will spell out a two-word phrase reading down.





PuzzleNation delivers the sudoku in four levels of difficulty: Easy, Medium, Hard, and better-get-abig-mug-of-coffee-first Expert. We think we have the best solving interface on the Web, too.

This sudoku below may look crazy, but it's just a regular puzzle. After solving it, however, follow the instructions below to arrive at a two-word phrase. *(Sudoku grid by Thomas Snyder.)*




- **1.** There is one grey square and one grey circle in each row and column. Transfer the numbers in the grey squares down to the bottom of the puzzle. Transfer the numbers in the circles across to the right side of the puzzle.
- **2.** The side and bottom of the puzzle are divided into four sections each. Add up the numbers in each section.
- **3.** Translate your totals into their alphanumeric equivalents, so that 1 = A, 2 = B, and so on.


On PuzzleNation, you can buddy up with your friends and then challenge them to our two-player puzzle games. In each of the puzzles below, someone on the left has buddied up with someone on the right according to a certain rule. (Each puzzle uses a different rule. The puzzles are separated by dashed lines.) Draw a straight line connecting the proper buddies. In doing so, you will cross off certain letters. The letters that remain, reading down the three columns in succession, will spell out the two-word answer to this puzzle.



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A Tanglewords is like a word search in reverse: We give you the words, and you figure out how to make them all fit into the grid so that every square is filled. The starting positions of all the words are shown (some will be used more than once), and words can extend in a straight line in any direction. On PuzzleNation, you can play Tanglewords as a single-player puzzle... or as a challenging two-player strategy game.

GuessWorks is like a supersized Hangman. The letters you guess form not words but entire clues; the answers to those clues are used to put together a pithy little quote. Figure out the quote and win! The one-player game is addictive enough, but the two-player game requires thoughtful strategy, as every guess you make is revealed to your opponent.

Each of the previous puzzle answers represents a series of guesses in a GuessWorks game. Look up each letter according to its puzzle number in the chart below, and then fill those letters into the GuessWorks game on the next page. (For example, if there is an A in Puzzle 1's answer, it would go in the third clue, in spaces 2, 8, and 12.) You'll soon see clues form. When you've figured out the answer to a clue, write it in the spaces on the right side of the page. Then transfer THOSE letters to the quote down below.
