Home-made Wine Section

Classes will be judged according to the handbook of the National Guild of Wine and Beer Judges.

Additional Wine Section Rules:

- Additional Wine Section Rules:
- All wines must have been made by the exhibitor and by the process of fermentation. Fortification is not allowed by any method. (This rule does not apply to class 16.)
- Bottles: Wine should be exhibited in clear glass wine bottles Bordeaux type of approx. 70/75cl capacity. For the liqueur class clear colourless half size wine bottles must be used. Beer should be entered in 1 pint plain beer bottles (clear or brown coloured) and sealed with a screw stopper or crown cap.
- Levels : Wine bottles should be filled so that the distance between the bottom of the cork and the surface of the wine is between 5mm (¼ inch) and 25mm (1 inch). For liqueurs fill distances and cork types apply as per wine. Beer bottles should be filled so that the distance from the underside of the stopper/cap is between 12.5mm (½ inch) and 25mm(1 inch).
- Corks: only plain flanged corks with white plastic or natural cork tops shall be used.
- Entry forms can be obtained from nigelapalmer@tiscali.co.uk and should be returned by 10 May 2016. Entries will also be accepted on the day, but providing this information in advance will greatly assist the organisers in their preparation.

If you would like to enter any of the team sports over the weekend. Please contact your local Centre or Regional/Divisional Secretaries as soon as possible. Alternatively please attend the Open Sports Meeting in the Activities Marquee on Saturday 27th May at 10.30hrs.

Centre Secretaries are requested to notify the organisers of each sport they wish to enter no later than two weeks prior to the event.

The Tournament

- The individual competition organisers will decide the final competition format when the final number of teams entered is known.
- Team representatives are requested to confirm entries at the Sports Coordinators meeting at 10.30hrs on Saturday 27th. Meeting venue to be confirmed.
- Please note: If you have not been asked to play for a Centre Team or are interested in joining a team, please contact the relevant organisers at the Open sports Meeting in the Activities Marquee at 10.30hrs on Saturday.
- Details of the competitions will be available at the information Centre, in the Caravan Club Marquee from Saturday midday.
- The finals for all competitions will be played at the times specified by the organisers in the Information Marquee.
- Members of the winning teams and runners up in each event will receive medals.
- Centre's should register no later than two weeks prior to the event to gain points towards the Participants Trophy
- All finals will be held at the discretion of the organiser.

Fun Run

Registration will be at the time and place specified in the Daily Programme.

This is not a competition. It is hoped however that it will appeal to both the serious and casual runners and thereby increase participation and enjoyment for many more people.

The event will have a mass start, for people of all ages to run over a three-mile course around the site.



Darts Championship

Rules of Participation:

- Teams to consist of one lady and one gentleman from each Centre (18yrs and over).
- Dart board to be 5ft 8in to the centre and 7ft 9¾in from the oche.
- Start of the match to be decided by the throw of a single dart, the nearest the bull being the first to throw in the first leg. The other pair will throw first in the second leg. If the score is level after two legs, both teams will throw a single dart and again the nearest the bull will throw first. A double is not required to start the match.
- Play will then alternate from one team to another until the game is finished.
- A double is required to finish the match. Bust rule applies – ie, if a player should make a higher score than is required, then he/she reverts to the score at the start of that throw.
- The draw will be displayed and regularly updated in the Information Centre in The Caravan Club Marquee. Owing to the tight schedule, players are requested to turn up for their matches at least 10 minutes before the published starting times. Failure to arrive on time will result in a bye for the other team. Losing teams will be asked to score the following match.
- Preliminary rounds will be three legs of 301.
- Quarterfinals will be three legs of 401.
- Semi-finals will be three 3 legs of 501.
- The final will be five legs of 501.
- Members of the winning team and the runners-up in each Group will receive medals.
- Register your Centre by two weeks prior to the event to gain points towards the The Presidents Trophy.



Lawn Darts Championship

Rules of Participation:

- The competition is organised on a knockout basis.
- A team should consist of two males and two females of any age from 14 years upwards.
- The team does not necessarily have to belong to the same family.
- Entries are to be sent to the organisers
- Other entries may be put forward at the event no later than at the Sports Co-ordinator's meeting, 10.30hrs on Saturday 27th in the Activities Marquee.
- Timings: See General Programme.
- Members of the winning team and the runners-up will each receive medals.
- Register your Centre two weeks prior to the event to gain points towards the The Presidents Trophy.
- How to play
- Two rings are places on the ground 10 meters apart.
- The aim is to get the darts into the circle, or as close to the circle as possible.
- Each team member will have two darts to throw.
- Each dart that lands in the ring earns 3 points. The nearest dart out of the ring scores 1 point.
- Each dart must stick into the ground to be counted.
- Each team will have the same amount of darts to throw.
- The team with the most points wins!

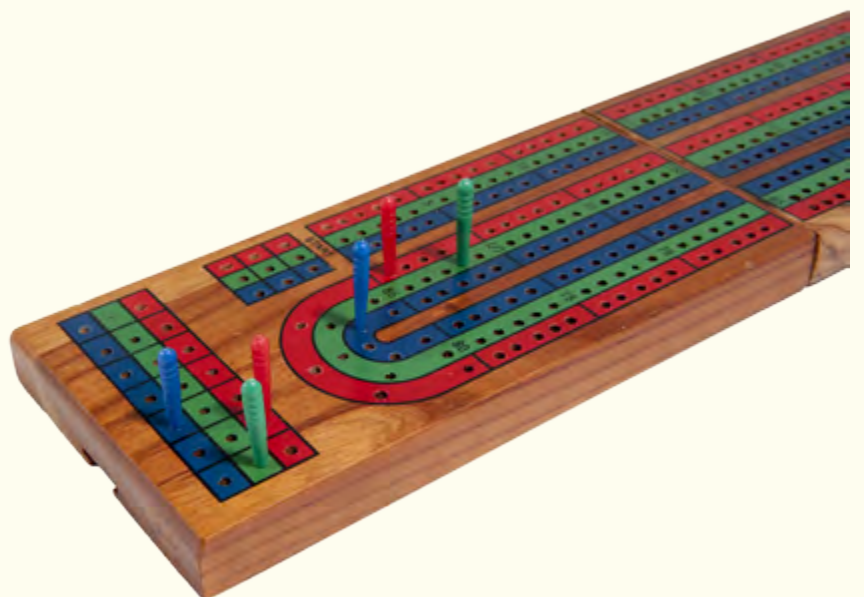


Cribbage

Organised by TBC

Rules of Participation:

- The competition will be open to 64 people in 32 couples. Individuals may apply and will be paired up if possible. Pre-booking of teams is required and teams will require a team name.
- A copy of the rules will be emailed out to each team once they register, and will also be available on each table during the match.



Petanque

Organised by TBC

Rules of Participation:

- Each Centre and other identified Lines (i.e. Independent, Blue Badge, etc.) can enter a team of two people of any age from 14 years upwards. Additional teams from Centres or other Lines may be permitted if the entry is under-subscribed.
- The game is played with six metal Petanque boules (balls). Each player throws three boules. Some sets of boules will be available from the umpire. Own sets may be used.
- The Competition in the first three rounds is on a sudden death knockout basis. The Quarter/Semi Finals and the Final itself will be decided by best of three Ends.
- Boules will be thrown from a 50cm circle once the start team is decided by the toss of a coin.
- The boule, when thrown, should rest comfortably in the hand with the fingers and thumb as close together as possible and with the palm facing the ground.
- The first thrower throws the Cochonnet (Jack) between 6m and 10m away.
- He/She then throws the first boule trying to place it close to the Cochonnet.
- A player in the other team then tries to throw his boule nearer to the Cochonnet, or knock away the leading boule. The boule nearest the Cochonnet leads.
- Then it is up to a player in the team not leading to throw until his team gets a leading boule and so on. When a team has no more boules the players of the other team throw theirs and try to place them as close as possible to the Cochonnet.
- When both teams have no more boules the points are counted. The winning team gets as many points as it has boules nearer the Cochonnet than the best of the losing team.
- The first team to reach 13 points is the winner of the End. In the first three rounds the winner will go on to the next round (see 3 above.)
- The draw for the first round will be on display in the Information Centre from 09.00hrs Sunday
- The Rules are taken from those of the British Petanque Association.
- Those requiring more information on the competition and to submit entries should contact the organiser. Entries should be received two weeks prior to the event. Other entries may be put forward, subject to size of total entry, but no later than the Open Sports meeting at 13.00hrs on Saturday afternoon in the Activities Marquee.

Members of the winning team and the runners-up will each receive medals.
Register your Centre two weeks prior to the event to gain points towards The Presidents Trophy.
