- 8. The Townshend Acts did the following:
 - Colonists had to house British troops, and provide food as well as shelter.
 - Taxes were placed on some goods brought into the colonies.
 - To enforce the taxes, Parliament issued writs of assistance.
 These were search warrants British officers could use to enter homes or businesses in search of smuggled goods.
- 9. The Sons of Liberty asked colonial merchants not to sell **British** goods at all.

- 11. List 2 interesting facts about the Boston Massacre.
 - The British call the Boston Massacre the "Incident on King Street".
 - After the incident, both sides tried to use propaganda in the newspapers to make the other side look bad. One famous engraving by Paul Revere shows Captain Preston ordering his

- men to fire (which he never did) and labels the Custom House as "Butcher's Hall".
- There is some evidence that the colonists planned the attack on the soldiers.
- One of the men killed was Crispus Attucks, a runaway slave who had become a sailor. The other victims included Samuel Gray, James Caldwell, Samuel Maverick, and Patrick Carr.
- There was little evidence against the four civilians arrested and they were all found not-guilty in their trial.
