



Help your child colour the corn by painting with some bubble wrap. Just dip and dab on the corn. Have a discussion about corn.




How This Activity Helps

How This Activity Helps


As your child identifies and sorts the farm elements by their colours, their cognition is enhanced.

How This Activity Helps


Your child learns more about the farm produce, which expands their knowledge about the farmer's world.



Farm Animal Cube

What does a horse do? How about a hen? Get ready to imitate the different farm animals!

Cut and glue the cube together. Then, ask your child to roll the cube and imitate the animal that turns up.




As your child pretends plays as animals, their motor muscles are enhanced.





Find My Home


Where does a hen, sheep, and cow live on the farm? Do you know?


Help your child match the animal with its home by drawing a line using a writing tool. Introduce them to the homes of different farm animals.














How This Activity Helps


As your child matches the animals with their homes, their problem-solving abilities are enhanced.

How This Activity Helps


As your child helps the farmer through the maze, they exercise their concentration and problem-solving skills.




Farm Counting

How This Activity Helps


Your child becomes familiar with the structure of each number. This improves their numeracy.




F For Farm

How This Activity Helps


This activity will enable your child to become familiar with the structures of different letters.

How This Activity Helps


Your child recognises the shapes by name, which enhances their cognition.
