As a social worker, jail chaplain, and justice advocate, Bethany Dearborn Hiser pushed herself to the brink of burnout—and then kept going. 





DISAGREEING WITHOUT DIVIDING THE CHURCH

We generally assume that those sitting around us in church share our beliefs. But when our personal convictions are contested by fellow Christians, everything changes. When other Christians doubt or deny our convictions, we don't experience it as a mere difference of opinion but as a violation of an unspoken agreement.

Tim Muehlhoff and Rick Langer offer a guide to help Christians navigate disagreements with one another. In today's polarized context, Christians often have committed, biblical rationales for very different positions. How do we discern between core biblical convictions and secondary issues? 

HURTING YET WHOLE

RECONCILING BODY AND SPIRIT IN CHRONIC PAIN AND ILLNESS

What if the things we most fear about our bodies—our vulnerability to illness and pain—are exactly the places where God meets us most fully?

As Liuan Huska went through years of chronic pain, she wondered why God seemed absent and questioned some of the common assumptions about healing. What do we do when our bodies don't work the way they should? What is healing when one has a chronic illness? Can we still be whole when our bodies suffer?

The Christian story speaks to our experiences of pain and illness. In the embodiment of Jesus' life, we see an embrace of the body and all of the discomfort and sufferings of being human. Countering a gnosticism that pits body against spirit, Huska takes us on a journey of exploring how healing is not an escape from the limits of the body but becoming whole as souls in bodies and bodies with souls.

Lamar Hardwick was thirty-six years old when he found out he was on the autism spectrum.

While this revelation helped him understand and process his own experience, it also prompted a difficult reevaluation of who he was as a person. And as a pastor, it started him on a new path of considering the way disabled people are treated in the church.

Disability and the Church is a practical and theological reconsideration of the church's responsibilities to the disabled community. Too often disabled persons are pushed away from the church or made to feel unwelcome in any number of ways. As Hardwick writes, "This should not be."

He insists that the good news of Jesus affirms God's image in all people, and he offers practical steps and strategies to build stronger, truly inclusive communities of faith.



In fact, families impacted by autism are nearly 84% more likely to never attend religious services due to a felt lack of inclusion. Similar studies report that 46% of families impacted by disability have never been asked how their child and family could be included in the life of the church.

When we are faced with such a high percentage of families who report that they are unable to be involved with their local church due to disability, it communicates that the church has not paid enough attention to how those who are absent view the church. . . . If the church is to forge forward into the future, we must recapture her original intent of inclusion and access into God's kingdom. If you believe that the local church must lead the way in creating disability inclusive communities—communities for people of all cultures and with all types of conditions—this book is for you.

Throughout American history, Black people were not given the freedom to acknowledge their suffering. A.D. Thomason believes that the Holy Spirit brings freedom and liberation as we're able to name our pain, recognize its roots in history and society, and seek healing.

While many saw a confident, six-foot-five Black man, A.D. "Lumkile" Thomason lived most of his life in fear and anguish, deeply wounded by encounters with violence, abandonment, and family tragedy. Belonging has never come easily for me.

Growing up, there was my mutated national identity to deal with—my not-quite-American, not-quite-Indonesian soul, restless in both countries. Later, when I finally came out as a celibate gay Christian, I found I didn't fit as easily into the church as I used to either. Maybe you're caught in the same tension as me, wanting to fit somewhere even as you're permanently out of place. Maybe you feel like an alien.


If so, let's be aliens together.

AFRICAN AMERICAN BIBLICAL INTERPRETATION AS AN EXERCISE IN HOPE

Growing up in the American South, Esau McCaulley knew firsthand the ongoing struggle between despair and hope that marks the lives of some in the African American context. A key element in the fight for hope has long been the practice of Bible reading and interpretation that comes out of traditional Black churches.

New Testament scholar McCaulley argues that reading Scripture from the perspective of Black church tradition is invaluable for connecting with a rich faith history and addressing the urgent issues of our times. He advocates for a model of interpretation that involves an ongoing conversation between the collective Black experience and the Bible, in which the particular questions coming out of Black communities are given pride of place and the Bible is given space to respond by affirming, challenging, and, at times, reshaping Black concerns. McCaulley demonstrates this model with studies on how Scripture speaks to topics often overlooked by white interpreters, such as ethnicity, political protest, policing, and slavery.

Ultimately McCaulley calls the church to a dynamic theological engagement with Scripture, in which Christians of diverse backgrounds dialogue with their own social location as well as the cultures of others.

KARIN MAAG is professor and director of the H. Henry Meeter Center for Calvin Studies at Calvin University. She is the author of *Does* the Reformation Still Matter?, Lifting Hearts to the Lord: Worship with John Calvin in Sixteenth-Century Geneva, and Seminary or University: The Genevan Academy and Reformed Higher Education, 1560-1620.







Julian of Eclanum (c. 386–455) was the bishop of Eclanum, located in modern-day Italy. In this volume in IVP's Ancient Christian Texts series, Thomas Scheck provides a new translation of Julian's commentaries on the biblical books of Job and those of three Minor Prophets: Hosea, Joel, and Amos. Here, readers will gain insight into how early Christians read texts such as God's speech to Job, Hosea's symbolic representation of God's unending love for a faithless Israel, Joel's anticipation of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and Amos's call for social justice.

While Julian was a well-known leader among the Pelagians, whose theology was famously opposed by Augustine of Hippo and ultimately determined to be outside the bounds of the church's orthodoxy, the Pelagian movement was a significant element within the early church. And although Julian's Pelagianism does not fundamentally affect the commentaries presented in this volume, Christians can gain insight into the truths of Scripture by reading the text alongside others, even when—or perhaps especially when—we might disagree with other aspects of their beliefs.

THOMAS P. SCHECK is associate professor of theology at Ave Maria University in Ave Maria, Florida. He is the author of *Origen and the History of Justification* and *Erasmus's Life of Origen*. He is also the editor of two volumes of Jerome's *Commentaries on the Twelve Prophets* and the translator for Origen's *Homilies on Numbers* in IVP's Ancient Christian Texts series as well as the translator of *Origen: Commentary on the Epistle to the Romans* and *St. Jerome: Commentary on Matthew* in the Fathers of the Church series and Jerome's commentaries on Isaiah and Ezekiel in the Ancient Christian Writers series.
