Catholic Teaching on Labor

Question: As we celebrate Labor Day, can you tell me about Catholic teaching regarding labor?

Answer: One of the most important principles of Catholic social teaching is the dignity of work and the rights of workers. Four encyclicals address this foundational social teaching: Rerum Novarum (1891) by Leo XIII, Quadragesimo Anno (1931) by Pius XI, Laborem Exercens (1981), and Centesimus Annus (1991) by John Paul II. They address both the theology and dignity of work. In Genesis, God takes the initiative in creating the world, calling forth human beings to be faithful stewards of creation. We are thus formed to share in God's continuing creative activity by partnering with God in finishing the world and helping bring it to completion and fulfillment. From this perspective, work can be spiritually understood in terms of sharing in God's ongoing activity to build, create, and transform the world. Human beings are co-creators with God. This vocation demands selfdiscipline.

Besides an exercise in self-discipline, work is also the means by which we develop and fulfill ourselves. In work, we shape the world and our environment. Through work, we also shape ourselves. Pope John Paul II summarized this point in *Laborem Exercens* #6, "the value of work is not primarily the kind of work being done, but the fact that the one who is doing it is a person."

Bulletin Minutes:

The Finance Council met on Tuesday, August 17, 2021 at 6:00 pm. Linda Dassler led us in prayer. The minutes from June were approved as emailed. The June Financial Report was reviewed and discussed. Laurie Jonasen reconciled the bank statements. All is fine. We received an update on the Roncalli Catholic Schools Capital Campaign. The roof project including new gutters with leafguard is scheduled to start on or about August 23. The parking lot project is awaiting quotes. Father Dave is looking for 2 additional members for the Finance Council. We do have someone with a new lawn-mowing business taking care of St. Isidore and St. Wendel cemeteries. No decision on a picnic in 2022 has been made. The Religious Education Endowment fund earned enough money to allow the use of some of the earnings. Likewise, the Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund has finally met and exceeded the state required level of funding, allowing some of the excess earnings to be earmarked for monument and base repairs as long as the Diocese approves the withdrawal of funds. This was referred to the Cemetery Committee. The Finance Council's next meeting will be Thursday, September 16, 2021 at 6:00 PM.



Question: "I just had a COVID vaccine. Am I still able to donate blood?"

Answer: Individuals who have received the COVID-19 vaccine must wait two days to donate blood or platelets. Vaccination day is "Day Zero", so for example, if they get vaccinated on Monday, they have to wait until Thursday (Monday – 0; Tuesday, Day 1; Wednesday – Day 2; Thursday – Cleared to donate.)





La personita se sube a la mesa de examen, se le coloca un par de auriculares especiales, y luego deben levantar la mano cuando escuchan un sonido.

Apuesto a que todos los padres que nos hemos sometido a una de estas pruebas con un niño en edad preescolar, especialmente uno de voluntad fuerte, hemos experimentado un momento en el que nos preguntamos: ¿Me pregunto si hay algo mal en su audición? ¿Es por eso por lo que ella no me escucha? "Ven aquí, ponte los zapatos, recoge tus juguetes, termina tus zanahorias, no toques eso", ella no está siendo traviesa, jsimplemente no puede oírlo!

Y luego ese momento, para aquellos de nosotros cuyos hijos pasaron la prueba de audición con gran éxito, se derrumbó en la realización de que, sí, pueden escuchar muy bien. Simplemente eligen la sordera.

Pero ¿cómo podemos realmente enojarnos cuando recordamos que le hacemos lo mismo a Dios todos los días? A menudo me pregunto si Dios, sentado en Su Cielo, se cansa de llamarnos de la misma manera que los padres jóvenes se cansan de dar instrucciones desatendidas a sus hijos pequeños. Ayuda a esa persona. Oye mi voz. Abre tu corazón. Entrégate de ti mismo aquí. Háblame.
