

The above icons represent some popular Google apps; do you recognize any of them? Write the name of the app in the box. All these apps are FREE with Google; all you need is a Google account. Still stuck on a few? Maybe you can match a description below to the icon above. Of course, they are not in the same order; what would the fun be in that? (The answers are at the end of this article).

A— Google Earth -- Explore anyplace on the planet, zoom in or out, take tours, and enjoy the constantly improving 3D buildings and land formations. Absolutely dazzling!

- B Google DRIVE Free software that works like Microsoft Office you get Google Docs (word processing), Sheets (spreadsheets), Slides (presentations) and more. You can also put (upload) ANY of your files onto the drive to share with others and have them available anywhere. There is a small charge if you exceed the free 15 GB space amount.
- C YouTube Now in the Google family. Search and find videos on ANY topic or any famous person. See videos from the past or from other countries. Great for entertainment! When you do a Google search on the internet you will most likely be presented with several videos. It is amazing the free videos you can find on YouTube!
- D Google MAPS A great way to travel and get from place to place. Probably better than the map software used in your car. Plan your travels and compare alternate routes.
- E Google Translate Translate from one language to another, super easy and super fun!
- F GMAIL A great email app to do your email on all your devices.
- G Google Play Entertainment access to movies, TV shows, books, music, and much more. Download or use charges may be applied.
- H Google PHOTOS Use the camera on your smart phone and your photos will be uploaded to Google Photos for you, freeing up space on your device. Now you can see and work with your photos on any device.
- I Google Calendar Keep all your appointments here. Can be synced to your iPhone.
- J Google Sheets (part of Google Drive) Free word processor similar to Microsoft Excel.
- K Google Contacts One place for all your contacts. Can be synced to your iPhone.
- L Google News A great source for news.
- M Google Slides (part of Google Drive) Free presentation app for creating great slides for your talk similar to Microsoft PowerPoint.
- N Google Docs (part of Google Drive) A great free word processor similar to Microsoft Word.

Shortly after 6 PM, Carol Joliat showed many keyboard shortcuts. Some of the shortcuts are:

- Function Keys: Many shortcuts use the numbered function keys in the top row of the keyboard. On many computers, you must hold the fn key and the numbered function key. On other keyboards, the function key alone works. The f1 key usually brings up a help screen.
- Ctrl + C: Copy selected item; Ctrl + X: cut a selection and store in clipboard; Ctrl + V: paste an item you've copied or cut
- Ctrl + P to print; Ctrl + S to save a file; Ctrl + A to select all; Ctrl + Z to undo last move
- Format text with Ctrl + B for bold, Ctrl + U for underline, Ctrl + I for Italics
- Windows key: Windows key and up arrow to maximize a window; Windows key and down arrow to minimize window; Windows key and left or right arrow to move the window to the right or left of screen; Windows key and Tab key to tile open windows

Regular Meeting

Program: Using Google for More Than Searching. Various board members shared Google tips.

- Dennis showed nine pages of icons showing Google apps. To use these apps, you
 must have a Google account.
- Gmail can be used in a browser or with another program such as Outlook.
- The Chrome browser works best with Google stuff.
- YouTube is now owned by Google; there is also YouTube Kids with content especially for kids.
- Jan Bredon uses Calendar that can be on your phone and other devices.
- Jan also uses YouTube TV. YouTube TV is a paid subscription that enables Jan and his family to cut the cord and eliminate cable. A discussion followed about that.
- Jan also showed Google Photos which backs up all your photos in the cloud. He showed the many ways you can search for photos by place, name, subject of photo, etc. You can also edit your photos, make albums, and share photos and albums

The group then took a break, and the 50/50 drawing was held. Gerald Schaeffer won the first prize and chose a set of hex keys. Susan Hill then won the cash prize.

The Google discussion continued with Dennis, Jan and others mentioning Google Drive to store items in the cloud and access them from anywhere, Google Docs which can almost replace Microsoft Office, Google Translate for translating to and from many languages, Google Maps, Google Earth, Waze, and Google Patents.

Other discussion:

Alice Lungociu mentioned that she saw Doris Ponzani who would like to attend meetings but can't; Doris wondered whether the club could use SKYPE to "broadcast" our meetings to members. Others also expressed interest, and Dennis will investigate it

Dennis mentioned that member Ann Meiser passed away in the last month.

Dennis said the Win 10 1903 upgrade is supposed to come out at the end of this month.
