COLLEGE AND CAREER:

SENIORS: The Woodlands High School Senior Awards night will be on **Thursday, May 16th**. At this time, for seniors, we will start collecting information for scholarships. The process of collection will consist of two steps:

Step One:

Please click on the following google document link to enter your scholarship information (Form will allow you to enter up to 10 scholarships). In order to fill out this google document, you will need this information:

1. Student ID (Your six digit lunch number)
2. Last Name
3. First Name
4. Full Name of Scholarship
5. Name of university, organization, or company that is providing the scholarship (Ex. Sam Houston State University, Touchdown Club, or JROTC)
6. Amount of Scholarship (For renewable scholarships for four years, include four year total in the blank.)
7. Link to Google Document: <https://goo.gl/forms/ni0EFaRnX8B9ruM73>

Step Two:

After submitting your google document, please go to CCC and turn in your scholarship documentation. Do not hand in your original copy of the award letter. Please only turn in copies.

Example: Bring copy of college award letter with name of scholarship(s) and the amount of awards. In addition, your name must be on this letter for verification. Please black out any identifying information such as grants, loans, or social security numbers. Our campus only needs to see the information that is pertinent to the scholarship or award. On top of the letter, you will need to fill out a brief form that will verify you submitted your google document online, along with your Student ID number and your name. Remember to print legibly on the form! If you get additional scholarships or awards later on in the year, simply repeat the process listed above.

Deadlines for Submission of Scholarships:

First Deadline: **May 2nd, 2019** for your award to be in the main body of the program

Second Deadline: **May 9th, 2019** for your award to be in the addendum of the program

JUNIORS: Mark your calendar for JUNIOR JUMPSTART on April 3 at College Park High School. This event will help you learn more about applying for college and how you can begin to prepare now for a senior year that is less stressful!

GPA Exemptions: If a current sophomore or junior would like to have a GPA exemption for a program such as football or orchestra for the 2019-2020 school year, please have them contact their counselor for a GPA exemption form. Students who might seek a GPA exemption should currently have at least a 4.0 weighted GPA.

The sophomore and junior classes have an updated GPA in family connection which reflects their most current GPA. Students have until Friday, September 6th, 2019 to apply for a GPA exemption. The counseling staff will run another GPA calculation in the summer to assist students and parents with their decision about GPA Exemptions. NEW EARLY CHECK OUT POLICY: Parents and guardians, please be aware that, in order to facilitate the most efficient check out process possible, **the new cut-off time for checking out a student is 2:00 pm. If your student must leave school early, please send a note containing all pertinent information the morning of the requested early release.** Your student should submit the note to the attendance office upon arrival to school, between classes, or during lunch and will be issued a Permit to Leave form in exchange. In this way, students will be able to leave class at the specified time with minimum disruption to teachers and other students. Thank you for your cooperation.

TWHS CLINIC: We have confirmed cases of Flu virus in our campus. The flu virus is a respiratory viral illness, spread by air (breathing in particles from an infected person's cough or sneezes) or by hand (touching an infected person or object then touching the mouth or nose). **PLEASE BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR POSSIBLE SIGNS IN YOUR CHILD AND KEEP THEM HOME TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF VIRUS.** The number one way to prevent flu is get vaccinated, it is not too late. Another effective way to prevent flu is practicing good hand washing to keep germs away.

If your child has a fever over 100 degrees, he or she must stay out of school until they are fever free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medications. Students with diarrheal illnesses must stay home until he/she free without diarrhea suppressing medications for at least 24 hours.
