



Year 7/8 students have been taking part in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Mathematics) classes this term as a part of a new initiative being introduced across NSW schools. The idea of STEAM is for students to use a multi-disciplinary approach to foster skills in collaboration, problem-solving, creativity and critical thinking in order to resolve issues in real world contexts. At UCS students were divided into four groups with each group being given a different project all relating to the school ag plot. The featured projects include an ag plot sign, a watering system for the grapevines, a glasshouse and a whole school composting system. Not only do each team have to design and make a prototype of the physical project they have been given, but also provide various plans, maps and scaled working drawings.

Eggy Veggie Muffins

Try this easy, healthy, delicious lunchbox filler with

a 3.5 health star rating for recess or lunch. Makes 12 muffins

- Ingredients: 1 cup corn* or swap for grated potato
- 1 tbsp oil
- 1 cup reduced fat milk
- 1 cup reduced fat grated cheese
- 1 tsp pepper
- 2 cups of children's favourite vegetables, grated (e.g.1 carrot and 1 zucchini)

Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C and place paper muffin cases in a 12 hole muffin trav.
- 2. Whisk eggs, milk and pepper in a bowl.
- 3. Add vegetables, cheese and corn* and mix. Spoon the mixture into muffin cases.
